1) The only difficult part of this dance is getting people to do the allemande right 1½ times!

- 3) In this modern version I have changed the formation from longways single minor to a circle with the ladies standing on their partner's left. I have also interpreted the 'clapping' and have substituted the 'chasée in & out' for the original 'lead out & in'.
- 4) The dance was published without permission and without appropriate attribution in Dancing Round the Maypole, EFDSS (1999).

Dance:

- A 1-4 Partner back-to-back
 - 5-8 Partner right-hand turn 1½
- B 1-4 Partner clap (own, right, own, left, own, left, own, right)
 - 5-8 Partner chasée in and out *(face away from partner to face next partner at end)*
